

- 1) All boats owned by Club members, using Club facilities, must have a **current** Club decal. The decal is to be located on the boat's port stern. Decals are available from the Rear Commodore upon initial boat storage request and again on replacement request. In-season boat storage runs from May 1 to December 1 and winter storage runs from December 1 to May 1.
- 2) All boats with a currant decal are permitted incidental use of the docks. Incidental use shall mean:
  - a) Use in connection with racing, either to preparation for a race or after a race is completed. In the case of boats that are dry-stored on the Club property, use shall include non-racing use of the docks for a period not to exceed two days before the start of a racing event and two days after the completion of a racing event.
  - b) Use by day-sailing or cruising members for embarking or debarking passengers or supplies. These activities shall not impede the usage of the docks by racing boats, particularly between 12:00 p.m. Friday and 6:00 p.m. Sunday.
- 3) Docks, ramps and hoists are reserved solely for Club member's usage and for visiting sailors participating in races on weekends, beginning at 3 p.m. Friday through 5 p.m. on Sunday, Friday of Memorial Day Weekend through Labor Day inclusive.
- 4) Boats not participating in races shall retire from the docks when requested by a participating sailboat, Dock-Master, or Flag Officer. During harbor races, the small docks shall be free of non-competing boats.
- 5) Visiting boaters from recognized yacht clubs are welcome to anchor off the Club and use restrooms and showers.
- 6) Visiting boaters may use the Club's facilities at other times with the permission of the Dock-Master or the Rear Commodore.
  - a) A visiting boater's boat may anchor in Club waters at any time and use its own dinghy to come ashore. No tender services are provided by the Club. Visiting boats are not permitted on the docks on weekends. Visiting boaters may use the docks and anchorage at their own risk.
  - b) Visiting boaters may use the docks during the week and off-season with permission. Visitors must register with the Dock Master or authorized representative and pay a fee, in advance, of \$1.50 per foot for each day of their visit. For the purposes of these rules, a "day" shall mean a period of more than four (4) hours, either consecutively or cumulatively.
  - c) Invited visiting boaters' sponsors are liable for unpaid fees and expenses of their guests.
- 7) Positively no boat shall moor unattended on the dock overnight except in exceptional circumstances. The owner or a responsible person must remain aboard overnight.
- 8) Outside docks are reserved for vessels requiring deep draft (over 4 ft). Powerboats and dinghies shall not use outside docks.
- 9) When tying to the docks, maximize space for other boats. When possible, move to ends of docks and as close to other boats as possible.
- 10) Committee Boat docks shall only be used for temporary dockage during loading and unloading.
- 11) No dinghies or tenders are to be stored on docks or ramps except or designated dinghy racks. Dinghies shall dock at the extreme inshore end of the small docks, south of the committee boats.
- 12) No personal watercraft, i.e. jet-skis, may be launched from Club property.
- 13) Replace and properly store hoses after use.
- 14) Place all trash in receptacles at the top of the pier.
- 15) Dock electricity is fused for 20 amp-110 volt.

Exceptions to these rules may be made by a Flag Officer, the Dock-Master or Club Manager, to accommodate special situations such as docking in distress, boats requiring repair, boats en route to Club-sponsored events, and boats participating in patrolling or Race Committee.
